Constitution Day and Citizenship Day

Each year, Grand Canyon University recognizes Constitution Day, commemorating the Sept. 17, 1787, signing of the U.S. Constitution. In 2024, Grand Canyon University observed Constitution Day and Citizenship Day the week of September 16th.

Faculty in the College of Humanities and Social Sciences offered various lessons in their classrooms followed by classroom discussions. On September 17th, the Pre-Law Society had an outdoor booth inviting students, faculty, and staff to share and discuss the importance of Constitution Day and Citizenship Day. In addition, an email communication was sent to all employees and students that included a link to the National Archives to learn about the creation and history of the Constitution as well as announcements on social media, digital postings and learning platforms.
