¹ MOU 7433: This scholarship is only valid for applicants who are current students of a Maricopa Community College Associate Degree Nursing Program and submit a complete application for the Maricopa Nursing RN-BSN NCEP beginning on or before May 19, 2025. By committing to start your NCEP through our online or local cohort offerings, Grand Canyon University will offer you a scholarship rate of \$250 per credit hour for the 21 undergraduate NCEP credits required to complete the pathway. This scholarship will be applied at the same time the tuition charges occur.

² Total Credit Hours for Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) Completion: 120 Credits. General Education Requirements (May be taken at GCU or substituted through course equivalency): MAT-144 College Mathematics (4 credits) and BIO-319 Applied Nutrition (4 credits). Recommended elective coursework to fulfill baccalaureate requirements for graduation (120 credit hours): UNV-103 University Foundations (online) and CWV-101 Christian Worldview (online). Students must have 120 credit hours to graduate with a Bachelor of Science in Nursing at Grand Canyon University. Residency Requirement: Undergraduate students must complete at least 30 semester credits of coursework in a Grand Canyon University program to satisfy residency requirements. Upper Division Credit Requirement: For a baccalaureate degree, a student must earn a minimum of 36 semester credits in upper division (300 or above) courses.
